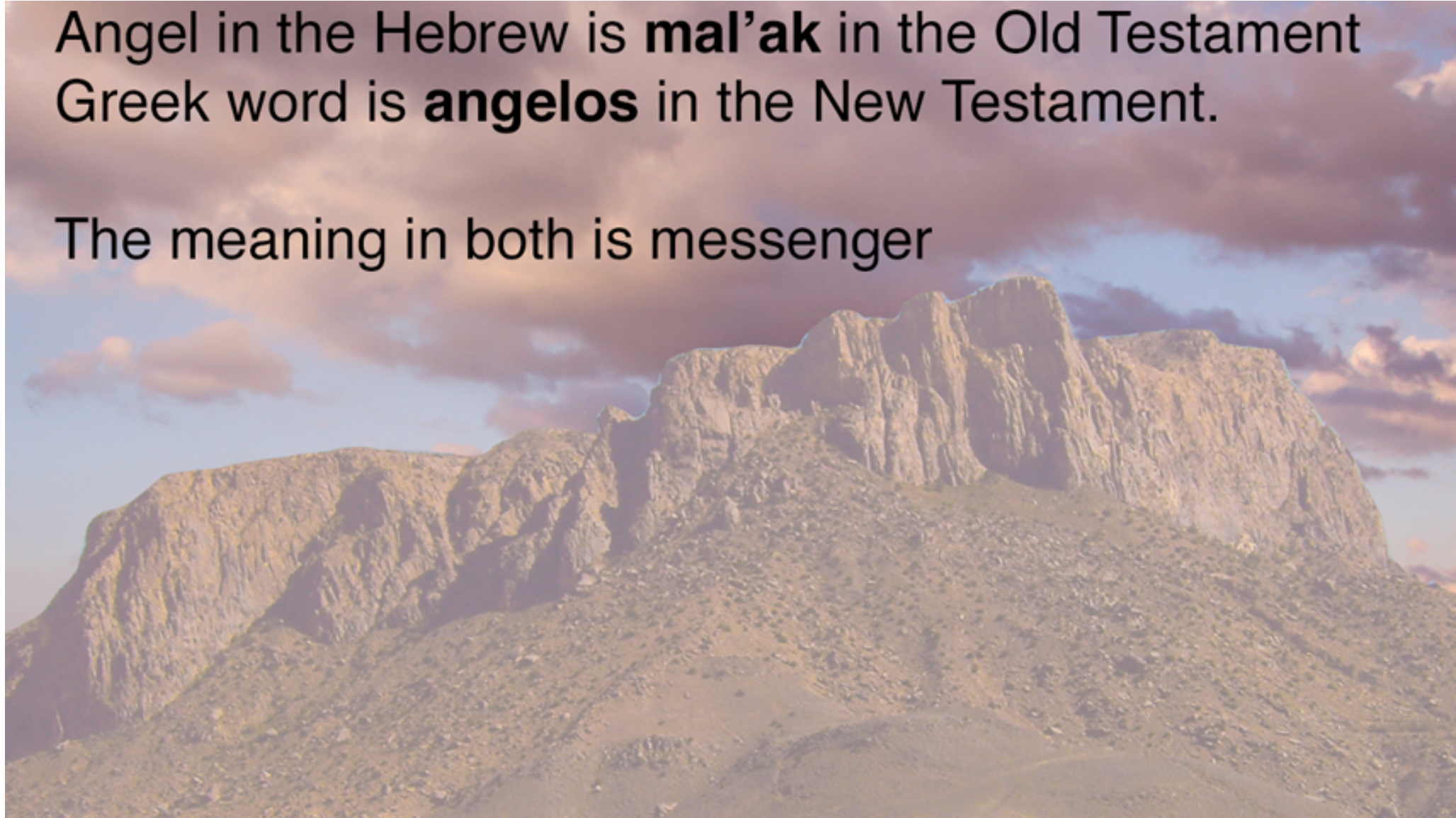


Angel in the Hebrew is **mal'ak** in the Old Testament
Greek word is **angelos** in the New Testament.

The meaning in both is messenger



When were angels created? **Before creation of the world**

Nehemiah 9:6 You alone are the LORD;

You have made heaven,

The heaven of heavens, with all their host,

The earth and everything on it,

The seas and all that is in them,

And You preserve them all.

The host of heaven worships You.

Host - 6635. aDbDx tsaba}, tsaw-baw´; means a mass of persons, an army, so this heavenly hosts speaks of angels.

Heb 1:14 -Are they not all ministering spirits sent forth to minister for those who will inherit salvation? How do Angels minister?

All Angels are Male

Every reference to angels in Scripture refers to them in the masculine gender. The Greek word for “**angel**” in the New Testament, **angelos**, is in the **masculine** form. In fact, the feminine form of angelos does not exist.

In the many appearances of angels in the Bible, never is an angel referred to as “she” or “it.” Furthermore, when angels did appear, they always appeared dressed as human males ([Genesis 18:2, 16](#); [Ezekiel 9:2](#)). No angel ever appeared in Scripture dressed as a female.

Archangels: High ranking angels

Dan.10:21,12:1 we are told Michael is the chief prince that watches over the nation of Israel, the people of Israel.

Prince -**8269**. **rAc sar**, sar; from 8323; a head person (of any rank or class):—captain (that had rule), chief (captain), general, governor, keeper, lord, ((-task-))master, prince(-ipal), ruler, steward.

In Jude 9 we are told Michael is an Archangel

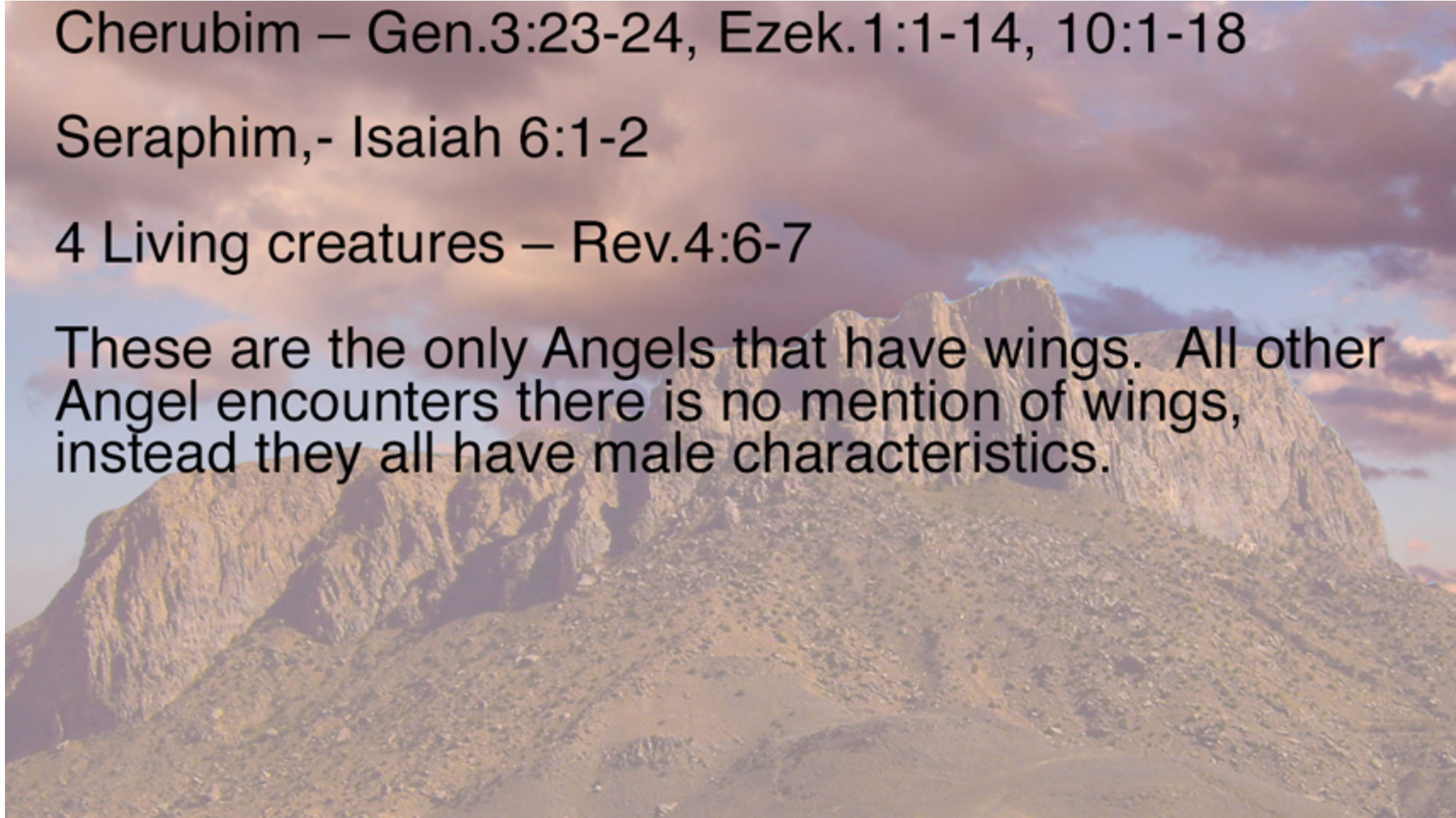
743. **ajrcaꝯggeloß archaggelos**, ar-khang´-el-os; from 757 and 32; a chief angel: — archangel.

4 Living creatures – Rev.4:6-7

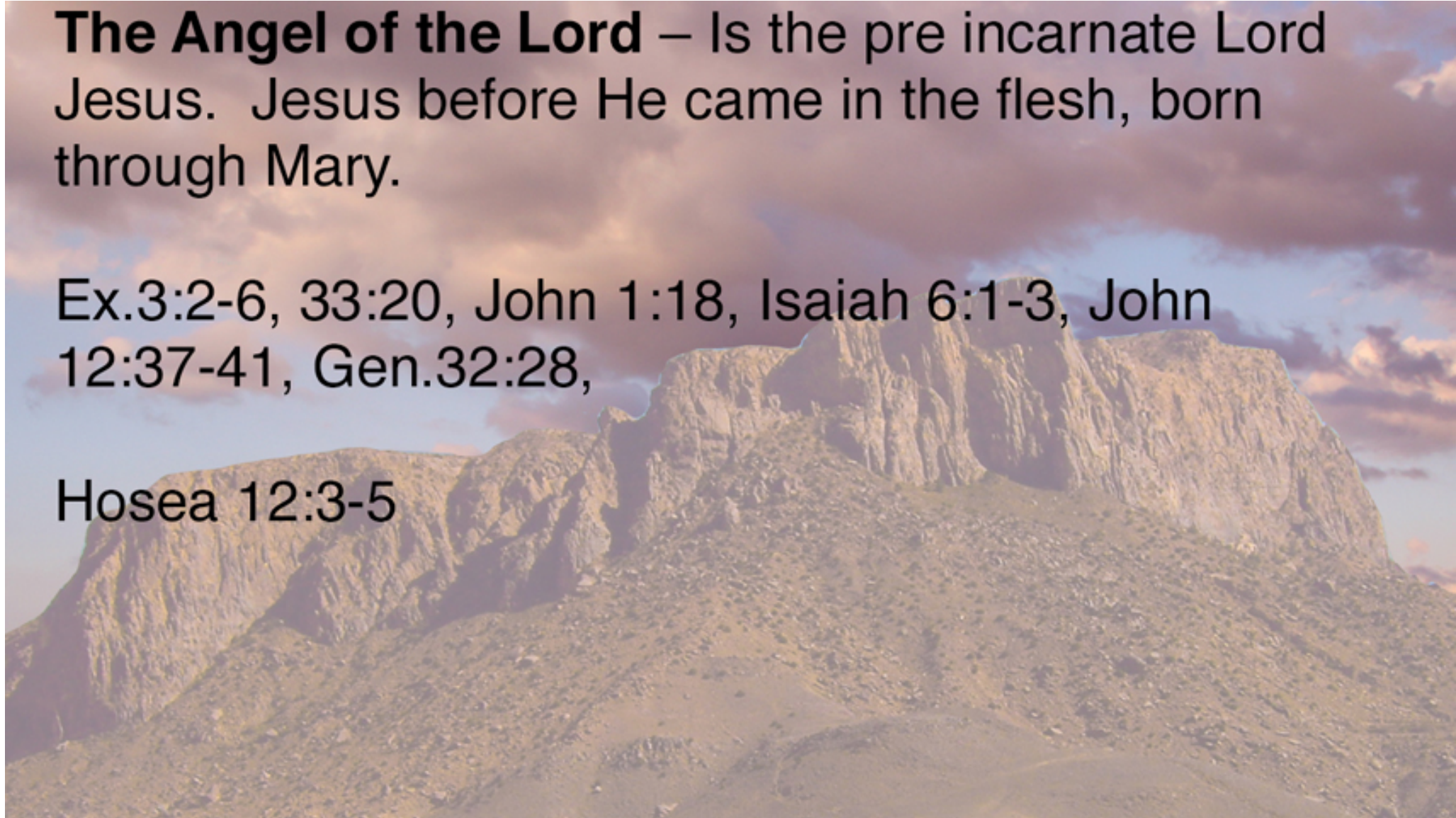
These are the only Angels that have wings. All other Angel encounters there is no mention of wings, instead they all have male characteristics.



The Angel of the Lord – Is the pre incarnate Lord Jesus. Jesus before He came in the flesh, born through Mary.

5 Simple truths about angels.

- 1) Angels are messengers from God
- 2) These messengers will never contradict the bible, God's word
- 3) The actions of holy angels will always be consistent with the character of Christ
- 4) A genuine encounter with a holy angel will glorify God, not the angel. Holy angels never draw attention to themselves. They do their work or give their message and then disappear.
- 5) Angels are to serve those who inherit salvation, they are not there to serve those who do not know Christ.
