Zacharias and His encounter with the angel Gabriel

Gabriel the angel appeared both to Daniel and Zacharias. (Daniel 9:20-21; Luke 1:11)

Gabriel the angel appeared to both at the time of sacrifice. (Daniel 9:20-21; Luke 1:8-10)

Daniel and Zacharias were both afraid when they saw Gabriel. (Daniel 8:17; Luke 1:12)

Daniel at first was speechless and Zacharias becomes mute. (Daniel 10:15; Luke 1:20)

Daniel's encounter – future messianic times

Zacharia's encounter – fulfilling of the messianic time
