MATTHEW 16:13-19

**When Jesus came into the region of
Caesarea Philippi, He asked His
disciples, saying, "Who do men say that
I, the Son of Man, am?"**

MATTHEW 16:13

**So they said, "Some say John the Baptist,
some Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one
of the prophets."**

MATTHEW 16:14

**He said to them, "But who do you say
that I am?"**

MATTHEW 16:15

Simon Peter answered and said, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

MATTHEW 16:16

**Jesus answered and said to him,
“Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah, for
flesh and blood has not revealed this to
you, but My Father who is in heaven.**

MATTHEW 16:17

**And I also say to you that you are Peter,
and on this rock I will build My church,
and the gates of Hades shall not prevail
against it.**

MATTHEW 16:18

And I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven."

MATTHEW 16:19

2 TIMOTHY 2:19-21

Nevertheless the solid foundation of God stands, having this seal: "The Lord knows those who are His," and, "Let everyone who names the name of Christ depart from iniquity."

II TIMOTHY 2:19

But in a great house there are not only vessels of gold and silver, but also of wood and clay, some for honor and some for dishonor.

II TIMOTHY 2:20

Therefore if anyone cleanses himself from the latter, he will be a vessel for honor, sanctified and useful for the Master, prepared for every good work.

II TIMOTHY 2:21

Christendom?

“The one word that best defines and describes the Mystery Kingdom, though it is not perfect, is ‘Christendom’, and not the purer word, ‘Christianity’.

Christendom

The term 'Christendom' applies everywhere in the world where belief in Jesus is somehow affirmed, rightly or wrongly, in orthodoxy or heretically.

Christendom

The parables of Matthew 13 describe conditions on earth and God's rule while the King is absent from the earth and is in Heaven. The Mystery Kingdom, 'Christendom' includes the time between Acts 2 and the return of Jesus Christ to the earth."

BINDING AND LOOSING

BO(u)ND Servants

And I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven."

MATTHEW 16:17-19

I shall give to you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; and whatever you bind on earth [forbid to be done], shall have been already bound [forbidden to be done] in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth [permit to be done], shall have already been loosed in heaven [permitted to be done].

2 CORINTHIANS 5:13-21

For if we are beside ourselves, it is for God; or if we are of sound mind, it is for you.

II CORINTHIANS 5:13

**For the love of Christ compels us,
because we judge thus: that if One died
for all, then all died;**

II CORINTHIANS 5:14

And He died for all, that those who live should live no longer for themselves, but for Him who died for them and rose again.

II CORINTHIANS 5:15

Therefore, from now on, we regard no one according to the flesh. Even though we have known Christ according to the flesh, yet now we know Him thus no longer.

II CORINTHIANS 5:16

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.

II CORINTHIANS 5:17

Now all things are of God, who has reconciled us to Himself through Jesus Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation,

II CORINTHIANS 5:18

That is, that God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not imputing their trespasses to them, and has committed to us the word of reconciliation.

II CORINTHIANS 5:19

Now then, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore you on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God.

II CORINTHIANS 5:20

For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

II CORINTHIANS 5:21

**For every house is built by someone, but
He who built all things is God.**

HEBREWS 3:4

And Moses indeed was faithful in all His house as a servant, for a testimony of those things which would be spoken afterward,

HEBREWS 3:5

**But Christ as a Son over His own house,
whose house we are if we hold fast the
confidence and the rejoicing of the hope
firm to the end.**

HEBREWS 3:6

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MATTHEW 16:19

When the Day of Pentecost had fully come, they were all with one accord in one place.

ACTS 2:1

And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting.

ACTS 2:2

**Then there appeared to them divided
tongues, as of fire, and one sat upon
each of them.**

ACTS 2:3

**And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit
and began to speak with other tongues, as
the Spirit gave them utterance.**

ACTS 2:4

Now when the apostles who were at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had received the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them,

ACTS 8:14

**Who, when they had come down,
prayed for them that they might receive
the Holy Spirit.**

ACTS 8:15

For as yet He had fallen upon none of them. They had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus.

ACTS 8:16

**Then they laid hands on them, and they
received the Holy Spirit.**

ACTS 8:17

Then Peter opened his mouth and said: “In truth I perceive that God shows no partiality.

ACTS 10:34

**But in every nation whoever fears Him
and works righteousness is accepted
by Him.**

ACTS 10:35

**The word which God sent to the children
of Israel, preaching peace through Jesus
Christ—He is Lord of all—**

ACTS 10:36

**That word you know, which was
proclaimed throughout all Judea, and
began from Galilee after the baptism
which John preached:**

ACTS 10:37

How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power, who went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him.

ACTS 10:38

**And we are witnesses of all things which
He did both in the land of the Jews and
in Jerusalem, whom they killed by
hanging on a tree.**

ACTS 10:39

**Him God raised up on the third day, and
showed Him openly,**

ACTS 10:40

**Not to all the people, but to witnesses
chosen before by God, even to us who
ate and drank with Him after He arose
from the dead.**

ACTS 10:41

And He commanded us to preach to the people, and to testify that it is He who was ordained by God to be Judge of the living and the dead.

ACTS 10:42

**To Him all the prophets witness that,
through His name, whoever believes in
Him will receive remission of sins.”**

ACTS 10:43

While Peter was still speaking these words, the Holy Spirit fell upon all those who heard the word.

ACTS 10:44

And those of the circumcision who believed were astonished, as many as came with Peter, because the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out on the Gentiles also.

ACTS 10:45

**For they heard them speak with tongues
and magnify God. Then Peter answered,**

ACTS 10:46

“Can anyone forbid water, that these should not be baptized who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?”

ACTS 10:47

**And he commanded them to be baptized
in the name of the Lord. Then they asked
him to stay a few days.**

ACTS 10:48

And it happened, while Apollos was at Corinth, that Paul, having passed through the upper regions, came to Ephesus. And finding some disciples

ACTS 19:1

**He said to them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you believed?"
So they said to him, "We have not so much as heard whether there is a Holy Spirit."**

ACTS 19:2

And he said to them, “Into what then were you baptized?” So they said, “Into John’s baptism.”

ACTS 19:3

Then Paul said, "John indeed baptized with a baptism of repentance, saying to the people that they should believe on Him who would come after him, that is, on Christ Jesus."

ACTS 19:4

**When they heard this, they were
baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus.**

ACTS 19:5

**And when Paul had laid hands on them,
the Holy Spirit came upon them, and
they spoke with tongues and prophesied.**

ACTS 19:6

Now the men were about twelve in all.

ACTS 19:7

"And it shall come to pass afterward that I will pour out My Spirit on all flesh; your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, your young men shall see visions.

JOEL 2:28

**And also on My menservants and on My
maidservants I will pour out My Spirit in
those days.**

JOEL 2:29

**“And I will show wonders in the heavens
and in the earth: Blood and fire and
pillars of smoke.**

JOEL 2:30

**The sun shall be turned into darkness,
and the moon into blood, before the
coming of the great and awesome day of
the LORD.**

JOEL 2:31

And it shall come to pass that whoever calls on the name of the LORD shall be saved. For in Mount Zion and in Jerusalem there shall be deliverance, as the LORD has said, among the remnant whom the LORD calls.
