**The next 39 chapters of Genesis covers
about 350 Years**

4 main events

- 1) Creation**
- 2) Fall of Man**
- 3) The Flood**
- 4) The Tower of Babel**

4 main characters

- 1) Abraham - man of faith, righteous, friend of God**
- 2) Isaac - a beloved son**
- 3) Jacob - The chosen**
- 4) Joseph - the suffering and glorified one**

Terah was 205 when he died in Haran

Abram was 75 when he left Haran after
Terah died....so

$205 - 75 = 130$ when Abram was born.

JOSHUA 24:2

תֵּרַח

Terah (teh rack) - of uncertain derivation.

Yet it is related to the Hebrew word for

moon יָרַח - (yaw ray yak).

שרַי

Sarai (Saw – rye) means princess. It is equivalent to the Akkadian Sarratu, means “queen” and was the name of the wife of the moon god called “Sin.”

מִלְכָּה

**Milcah (mil kaw) – means queen is also
equivalent to the Akkadian goddess
Milkatu a title of Istar of the moon god
Sin.**

יִסְכָּה

Iscah (yis – skaw) – means to watch, to observe. This could mean in reference of watching or observing the stars, the moon.

אַבְרָם

Abram (av – rawm) – exalted father

And he said, "Brethren and fathers,
listen: The God of glory appeared to our
father Abraham when he was in
Mesopotamia, before he dwelt in Haran,

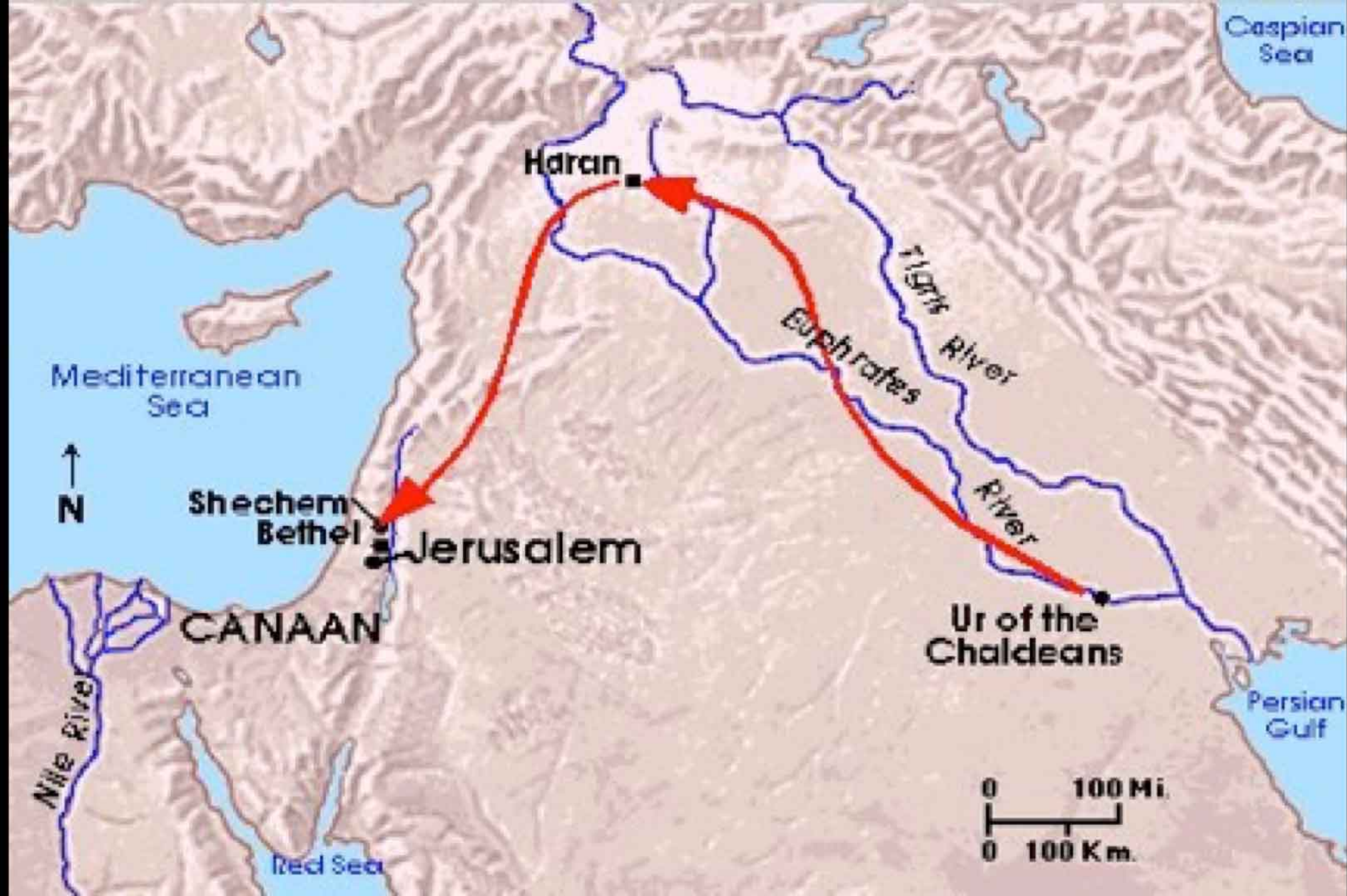
ACTS 7:2

Nation – (goy) – means nation. Later
on it will be used to describe the
Gentiles.

אָרַר

(aw rare) means to be bitterly cursed, to be under the curse, this curse is upon you.

קַלֵּל

(kaw lel) – despised or thought of as insignificant or treated lightly
