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Typology is just a fancy way of saying
symbols, foreshadowing, or.....
types of an object that represents
something else.

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Typology is a special kind of symbolism. (A symbol is something that represents something else.) We can define a type as a “prophetic symbol” because all types are representations of something yet future. More specifically, a type in Scripture is a person or thing in the Old Testament that foreshadows a person or thing in the New Testament.

Shadow (skia) - an image cast by an object and representing the form of that object

σῶμα

Substance (soma) - means a physical body

Tested (na saw) - to try, to prove.

Difference between Tests or Trials and Temptations:

Tests or Trials are outward, brought your way for you to pass and have victory and to bring out the best in you in your development to become Christlike.

Temptations come from within to get you to sin, to fail, and to bring out the worst in you.

A Test: (a trial) is a testing of your faith.

**A temptation: a testing to entice your flesh
to sin.**

of judgment,

- 7) YHWH Shemmah – The LORD is present (Ezekiel 48:35)
