Charge (mish-mer-ret) – to guard, to watch, to preserve.

מצוה

Commandments (mits-vaw) – a command, a precept of God, or guideline of God with the idea of Prohibition.

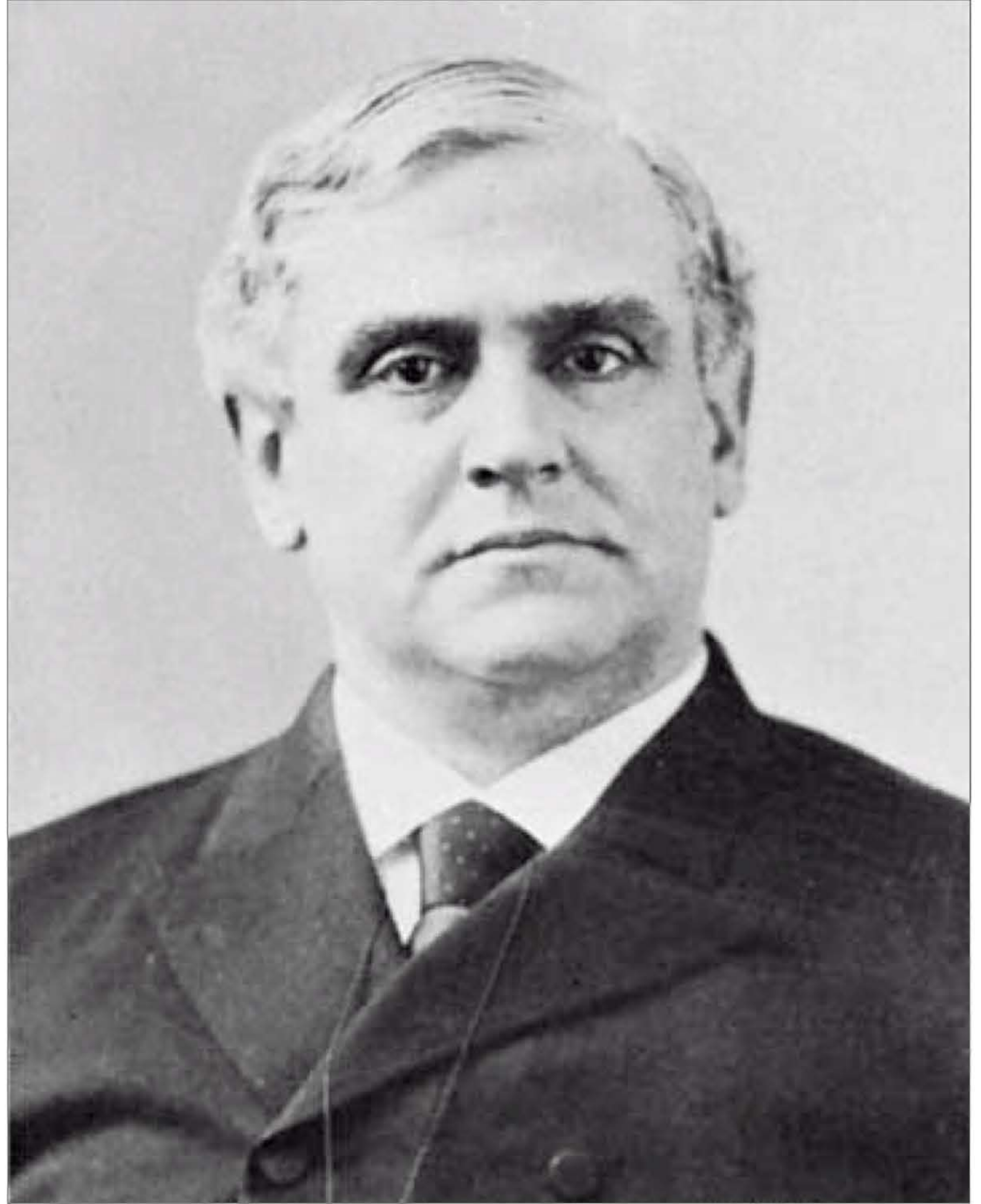
חֻקֵּי

Statutes (khoo-kaw) – means ordinance or rules in regards to customs or rituals. This would mean animal sacrifice, circumcision which was given to Abraham.

תּוֹרָה

Laws (tow-rah) – means law or teachings or instructions. It is a general term that describes the whole teachings or instructions of God.

Endearment (saw-khack) - means to sport, to play, to toy with. Literally "Isaac is sporting with his wife Rebekah."

תֵּי מַיִם

**Running water (Ki-Mayim) - means spring
of water.**

עֵשֶׂק

Esek (ay-sek) - meaning contention or to quarrel.

שִׂטְנָה

Sitnah (sit-nah) - meaning Emnity or hatred or hostility.

רְחִיבוֹת

Rehoboth (rekh-o-bot) - meaning spaciousness or enlargement because the Lord has made room for us, and we shall be fruitful in the land.

II TIMOTHY 1:7

δειλία

Fear (di-lee'-ah) – means timidity

δύναμις

Power (doo'-nam-is) – means power and strength. This is where we get our English word dynamite

ἀγάπη

**Love (ag-ah'-pay) – means love, i.e.
affection or benevolence**

σωφρονισμός

Sound mind (so-fron-is-mos') - means
discipline, self control.

πραΰς

Meek (praus) – a term used to describe a powerful stallion when it was broken and rideable. Still powerful, now useful, no longer independent. Now strong and useable.

PROVERBS 16:7

בְּאֵר שֶׁבַע

Beersheba (ba-eyr – she-vah) - meaning the well of the seven. This word comes from two words

בַּיֵּר

(ba-eyr) - means well

שִׁבְעַ

**(she-vah) - means seven but this word seven
comes from the root word**

שַׁבַּע

(sha-vah) - means to swear. Thus this word carries a double meaning, "the well of the seven" because of the seven lambs and the "well of the swearing" because they swore an oath.
