7 feasts of the religious calendar year speaks of Jesus

1st 3 feasts in 1st three months of the religious calendar years speaks of Jesus 1st coming. **Passover, unleavened bread** and **firstfruits** all speak of Jesus 1st coming.

4th feast – feast of **Pentecost**, or **feast of weeks** speaks of Jesus body, the church age

last 3 feasts in the last 3 months of the religious calendar year, **feast of trumpets**, **feast of atonement** and the **feast of tabernacle** – speaks of Jesus second coming.

ROMANS 15:4

Exodus 1:1 – “Now these” -
Hebrew word – וְאֵלֶּה (ve-el-leh)

Genesis – a birth of a family
Exodus – we will see a birth of a nation.

Genesis – ends with Israel down in Egypt welcomed and honored
Exodus – begins with Israel disrespected and in bondage to Egypt.

Genesis – Abraham a story of a few
Exodus – Moses and a story of millions

Genesis – Pharaoh knows Joseph and his God
Exodus – Pharaoh who knows not Joseph or his God

Genesis – a lamb was promised, Gen 22
Exodus – a lamb is slain – Ex 12

Exodus is a Greek word - ἔξοδος
ex'-od-os - means departure or
going out.

But concerning the dead, that they rise, have you not read in the book of Moses, in the burning bush passage, how God spoke to him, saying, *‘I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob’?*

MARK 12:26

Now all the people gathered together as one man in the open square that was in front of the Water Gate; and they told Ezra the scribe to bring the Book of the Law of Moses, which the Lord had commanded Israel.

NEHEMIAH 8:1

LUKE 24:27

The Theme of Exodus:

- 1. Redemption – Exodus 1-15**
- 2. Consecration – Exodus 16-24**
- 3. Worship – Exodus 25-40**

- **Redemption** means the purchase back of something that has been lost, by payment of a price or ransom.
- **Consecration** is being set apart for God
- **Worship** is right relationship with God for service.

1. The need of redemption pictured by the people's captivity in chpts 1-6
2. The might of the Redeemer displayed by the plagues on Egypt chpts 7-11
3. The character of the redemption purchased by blood, set free by power chpts 12-18
4. The duty of the redeemed, obedience to the Lord chpts 19-24
5. The provisions made for the failures of the redeemed are seen in the tabernacle and its services chpts 25-40
