

Gershom - Hebrew word – גּּרְשׁם – Ger shome – means Foreigner or Expulsion The eyes of the LORD are on the righteous, And His ears are open to their cry.

Jethro – Hebrew word – יְתְּרוֹ – yit tro – means his excellency, or his abundance. Most likely a title.

Abraham again took a wife, and her name was Keturah.

And she bore him Zimran, Jokshan, Medan, Midian, Ishbak, and Shuah.

Angel – Hebrew word – מֵלְאָדֵּ – mal awk – messenger, angel, representative.

"The Angel of the Lord" occurs 56 times in the Old Testament "Angel of God" 5 times "The Angel" 2 times "The Angel of His presence" once Vs 9 - The Angel of the LORD said to her...Vs 10 - Then the Angel of the LORD said to her...Vs 11 - And the Angel of the LORD said to her:

You-Are-the-God-Who-Sees; in Hebrew אֵל וְרָאִי - el roe e means God of seeing. Exodus 33:20 - But He said, "You cannot see My face; for no man shall see Me, and live."

John 1:18 - No one has seen God at any time...

1 John 4:12 - No one has seen God at any time...

Now Gideon perceived that He was the Angel of the LORD. So Gideon said, "Alas, O Lord GOD! For I have seen the Angel of the LORD face to face."

Then the LORD said to him, "Peace be with you; do not fear, you shall not die."

And Manoah said to his wife, "We shall surely die, because we have seen God!"

He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation.

Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you so long, and yet you have not known Me, Philip? He who has seen Me has seen the Father; so how can you say, 'Show us the Father'?

Christophany - comes from two Greek words; Christos, which means Christ, and phaneroo, which means to be revealed or to manifest. Therefore, a Christophany is a visible manifestation or appearance of Christ before taking on human form through the virgin birth.

1 Now it came to pass after these things that God tested Abraham, and said to him, "Abraham!"

And He said, "Do not lay your hand on the lad, or do anything to him; for now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only son, from Me."

Vs 15-16 says...The Angel of the LORD (YHWH),.... said, "By Myself I have sworn, says the LORD (YHWH).

For when God made a promise to Abraham, because He could swear by no one greater, He swore by Himself, saying, "Surely blessing I will bless you, and multiplying I will multiply you."

And He said, "Your name shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel; for you have struggled with God and with men, and have prevailed."

Then Jacob asked, saying, "Tell me Your name, I pray."

And He said, "Why is it that you ask about My name?" And He blessed him there.

So Jacob called the name of the place Peniel: "For I have seen God face to face, and my life is preserved." Elohim - אֱלֹהִים – Elohim – אֱלֹהִים – Elohim – בוּ – a means God ,ים – a mem at the end of a word shows its plural form so Elohim means Gods plural.

"You shall have no other gods before Me.

"You shall have no other" This phrase is one word in the Hebrew אַחָר (akh·air') it's an adjective and it is plural.

Wonderful – Hebrew wordd – פּלְאִי – pel lee – means incomprehensible, remarkable, extraordinary, secret. This word is only used of God. Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; It is high, I cannot attain it.

Binatarianism: the idea that a part of the Jewish tradition that there were actually Two YHWH's in the Old Testament, a YHWH sent from YHWH.
