EXODUS 10:28

EXODUS 11:8

Urged – Hebrew word – חֲזַק – Chaw zak – means to strengthen, to make strong. Interesting because this is the same verb used in Hardening or strengthening Pharaoh's heart.

Plundered – Hebrew word – נָצַל – nawt
sal – means to strip off the spoil, to snatch
away.

GENESIS 15:14

GENESIS 47:11

Succoth – Hebrew word - סֻכּוֹת - Sook
kot – means booths or temporary
dwellings.

The Etymology of this word begins with
סָכַח saw-kak means to block,
overshadow, screen, stop the approach,
shut off.

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“These are the words that Ipuwer answered the king.”

Exodus 4:9b ...that you shall **take water from the river and pour *it* on the dry *land***. The water which you take from the river will become blood on the dry land.”

Ipuwer writes:

“Behold Egypt is fallen to the pouring of water. And **he who poured the water on the ground** seizes the mighty in misery.”

Ipuwer 7:5

Exodus 7:20b...And all the waters that were in the **river were turned to blood.**

Exodus 7:21 The fish that were in the river died, the river stank, and the **Egyptians could not drink the water of the river.** So there was blood throughout all the land of Egypt.

Ipuwer writes:

The River is blood. If you drink of it, you lose your humanity, and **thirst for water.**" Ipuwer 2:10

Exodus 9:6b...and **all the livestock of Egypt died**; but of the livestock of the children of Israel, not one died.

Exodus 9:23b the LORD sent **thunder and hail**, and fire darted to the ground. And the **LORD rained hail on the land of Egypt**.

Exodus 9:31 Now the **flax and the barley were struck**, for the barley was in the head and the flax was in bud.

Ipuwer writes:

Gone is the Barley of abundance.....Food supplies are running short. The Nobles hunger and suffer....Those who had shelter are in the **dark of the storm**.

Ipuwer 6:3, 3:3, 7:13

Exodus 10:7 ¶ Then **Pharaoh's servants said to him, "How long shall this man be a snare to us?** Let the men go, that they may serve the LORD their God. Do you not yet know **that Egypt is destroyed?"**

Exodus 10:15 For they (locusts) covered the face of the whole earth, so that the land was darkened; and **they ate every herb of the land and all the fruit of the trees which the hail had left.** So there remained nothing green on the trees or on the plants of the field throughout all the land of Egypt.

Ipuwer writes:

"What shall we do about it? **All is ruin!**" Ipuwer 3:13

Exodus 12:29 And it came to pass at midnight that **the LORD struck all the firstborn in the land of Egypt**, from the firstborn of Pharaoh who sat on his throne to the firstborn of the captive who was in the dungeon, and all the firstborn of livestock.

Ipuwer writes:

“Behold plaque sweeps the land, blood is everywhere, with **no shortage of the dead**....He who buries his **brother** in the ground is everywhere....Woe is me for the grief of this time.”

Exodus 12:30 So Pharaoh rose in the night, he, all his servants, and all the Egyptians; and **there was a great cry in Egypt**, for there was not a house where there was not one dead.

Ipuwer writes:

“Wailing is throughout the land, mingled with lamentations.” Ipuwer 3:14

Exodus 12:35....and they had asked from the Egyptians articles of silver, articles of gold, and clothing.

Exodus 12:36 And the LORD had given the people favor in the sight of the Egyptians, so that they granted them *what they requested*. Thus they plundered the Egyptians.

Ipuwer writes:

People are stripped of **clothes....The slave takes** what he finds... Behold, **gold**, lapis, lazuli, **silver** and **turquoise, carnelian, amethysts, emeralds** and **all precious stones** are strung on the necks of the female slaves.”

Ipuwer 6:3,2:4-5,3:2-3

Exodus 28:17 And you shall put settings of stones in it, four rows of stones: *The first row shall be a **sardius (carnelian)**, a topaz, and an **emerald**; this shall be the first row;*

Exodus 28:18 the second row *shall be a **turquoise**, a sapphire, and a diamond;*

Exodus 28:19 the third row, a jacinth, an agate, and an **amethyst**;

Exodus 28:20 and the fourth row, a beryl, an onyx, and a jasper. They shall be set in **gold** settings.

All precious stones mentioned by Ipuwer may include the other stones of the Breastplate.
