

2 My brethren (He says this 19 times in the book), you must continually count, consider, or deem it pure joy or reckon It's a financial word...You must constantly add this up.

You must continually count or reckon it all joy by having cheerfulness or calm delight when you fall, by encountering or coming face to face with various diversified or varieties of trials.

Trial - to learn the nature or character of someone or something by submitting such to thorough testing or examination

But he said to her, "You speak as one of the [spiritually] foolish women speaks [ignorant and oblivious to God's will]. Shall we indeed accept [only] good from God and not [also] accept adversity and disaster?" In [spite of] all this, Job did not sin with [words from] his lips.

“Blessed are you when they revile and **persecute you**, and say all kinds of evil against you falsely for My sake. Rejoice and be **exceedingly glad**, for great is your reward in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

By those words, rejoice and be exceedingly glad the apostles did not intend a grin and bear it or act tough like nothing is happening attitude, nor is there any hint of enjoying the pain. "Rejoicing in suffering" does not mean Christians should act happy about tragedy when they feel like crying. Such a view distorts honesty and authentic expression of feelings. Christianity is not phony. Rather, the Bible aims the spotlight on the end result, the productive use God can make of suffering in our lives. To achieve that result, however, he first needs our commitment to trust Him, and the process of giving him that commitment can be described as rejoicing."

...Faith is tested through trials, not produced by trials. Trials reveal what faith we do have; not because God doesn't know how much faith we have, but so that our faith will be evident to ourselves and to those around us. If difficulties are received in unbelief and grumbling, trials can produce bitterness and discouragement. This is why James exhorted us to count it all joy. Counting it all joy is faith's response to a time of trial.
