"the words of the covenant," because they constituted the basis of the covenant between the Lord and his people.

²⁸So he was there with the LORD forty days and forty nights; he neither ate bread nor drank water. And He wrote on the tablets the **words** of the covenant, the Ten Commandments.

EXODUS 34:28

"the testimony," or "tablets of the testimony" because they constantly testified to the fact that the Lord had spoken to them. (Exodus 25:16; 32:15)

¹⁸And when He had made an end of speaking with him on Mount Sinai, He gave Moses two **tablets of the Testimony**, tablets of stone, written with the finger of God

EXODUS 31:18

"the tablets of the covenant," because the words of the covenant were written upon them by the finger of God.

Deuteronomy 9:9a When I went up into the mountain to receive the tablets of stone, the **tablets of the covenant** which the LORD made with you,.....

Deuteronomy 9:11 And it came to pass, at the end of forty days and forty nights, that the LORD gave me the two tablets of stone, the **tablets of the covenant**.

The LORD gave Moses the Tablet's of stone the first time with the Law written on it.

¹²Then the LORD said to Moses, "Come up to Me on the mountain and be there; and I will give you tablets of stone, and the law and commandments which I have written, that you may teach them."

EXODUS 24:12

¹⁹So it was, as soon as he came near the camp, that he saw the calf and the dancing. So Moses' anger became hot, and he cast the tablets out of his hands and broke them at the foot of the mountain.

Moses is the one who carved out the stone tablets.

¹And the LORD said to Moses, "Cut two tablets of stone like the first ones, and I will write on these tablets the words that were on the first tablets which you broke.

The Tablets were written on both sides:

¹⁵And Moses turned and went down from the mountain, and the two tablets of the Testimony were in his hand. The tablets were written on both sides; on the one side and on the other they were written.

EXODUS 32:15

Decalogue is from the Latin decalogus, which comes from the ancient Greek - δεκάλογος - dekálogos - means "ten words" which refer to the Ten Commandments.

- The first law forbidding the eating from the tree of knowledge of good and evil. (Genesis 2:16,17);
- Law of marriage (Genesis 2:24);
- Law of sacrifice (Genesis 4:1-7; Hebrews 11:4);
- Law against eating blood, and murder (Genesis 9:4-6);
- Law of circumcision (Genesis 17:1-14).

Did he not say to me, 'She is my sister'? And she, even she herself said, 'He is my brother.' In the integrity of my heart and innocence of my hands I have done this." ⁶And God said to him in a dream, "Yes, I know that you did this in the integrity of your heart. For I also withheld you from sinning against Me; therefore I did not let you touch her.

- 2) The ceremonial law
