

EXODUS



Sabbath - Hebrew word – שַׁבָּת *sha bot*
-means 7th day of the week, it comes from
the root wd - שָׁבַת *shaw-vat'*; a prim.
root; to repose, i.e. desist from exertion; to
cease.

¹⁵And remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt, and the LORD your God brought you out from there by a mighty hand and by an outstretched arm; therefore the LORD your God commanded you to keep the Sabbath day.

DEUTERONOMY 5:15

³ ...and keep **My Sabbaths**: I am the LORD
your God.

LEVITICUS 19:3B

³“Six days shall work be done, but the seventh day is a Sabbath of solemn rest, a holy convocation. You shall do no work on it; it is the Sabbath of the LORD in all your dwellings.

¹⁵Then the LORD God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to tend and keep it.

GENESIS 2:15

¹⁰For even when we were with you, we commanded you this: If anyone will not work, neither shall he eat. ¹¹For we hear that there are some who walk among you in a disorderly manner, not working at all, but are busybodies. ¹²Now those who are such we command and exhort through our Lord Jesus Christ that they work in quietness and eat their own bread.

II THESSALONIANS 3:10-12

²⁷ And He said to them, “The Sabbath was made for man, and not man for the Sabbath.

MARK 2:27

Festivals are yearly Sabbaths
New Moon – monthly Sabbaths
Sabbaths – weekly Sabbaths

All these point to Christ.

²⁸Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. ²⁹Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰For My yoke is easy and My burden is light.”

*To Mary, on the morning of the resurrection:
(Matt.28:8-10; John 20:11-18)*

⁹Now when He rose early on the **first day of the week,** He appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom He had cast seven demons.

MARK 16:9

The two disciples on road to Emmaus: (Mark 16:12-13: Luke 24:13-33)

¹³Now behold, two of them were traveling **that same day** to a village called Emmaus, which was seven miles from Jerusalem. ¹⁴And they talked together of all these things which had happened. ¹⁵So it was, while they conversed and reasoned, that Jesus Himself drew near and went with them.

LUKE 24:13-15

Jesus reveals himself to the disciples on Sunday evening.

¹⁹Then, the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in the midst, and said to them, “Peace be with you.”

JOHN 20:19

The disciples first received the Holy Spirit on a Sunday, continuing in John 20 it says:

²¹ So Jesus said to them again, “Peace to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you.”

²² And when He had said this, He breathed on them, and said to them, “Receive the Holy Spirit.

JOHN 20:21-22

¹⁵‘And you shall count for yourselves from **the day after the Sabbath**, from the day that you brought the sheaf of the wave offering: seven Sabbaths shall be completed. ¹⁶Count fifty days to the day **after the seventh Sabbath**; then you shall offer a new grain offering to the LORD.

LEVITICUS 23:15-16

⁷Now on the **first day** of the week, when the disciples came together to break bread, Paul, ready to depart the next day, spoke to them and continued his message until midnight.

ACTS 20:7

¹Now concerning the collection for the saints, as I have given orders to the churches of Galatia, so you must do also:

²On the first day of the week let each one of you lay something aside, storing up as he may prosper, that there be no collections when I come.

I CORINTHIANS 16:1-2

⁵One person esteems one day above another; another esteems every day alike. Let each be fully convinced in his own mind. ⁶He who observes the day, observes it to the Lord; and he who does not observe the day, to the Lord he does not observe it. He who eats, eats to the Lord, for he gives God thanks; and he who does not eat, to the Lord he does not eat, and gives God thanks.

¹⁸And I also say to you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it.

MATTHEW 16:18

Church – Greek word - **ἐκκλησία** –
ek lay sia – means religious assembly,
congregation of the church,

Assembly - Hebrew word - **קָהָל** (**qā-hāil**),
which means “assembly” or “congregation”
and often refers to Israel’s religious
gatherings.

²⁴And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, ²⁵not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching.
