

Offering - Hebrew word - קְרָבָּן Kor ban – means offering

Corban comes from the word קרב – ka rav – a noun - means "something brought near."

Sacrifice - Hebrew word - זְבַח – za vak – a verb and it means to slaughter.

Offering – Hebrew word - עָלָה oh-lah.
Olah comes from the verb עָלָה - alah
(same spelling, different vowels) which
means "to ascend" or "to climb."

Soothing aroma - Hebrew – נִיחֹחַ רֵיחַ היוֹחַ is neo ack ray ack meaning "soothing/pleasing" and "smell/odor"

¹⁴Now thanks be to God who always leads us in triumph in Christ, and through us diffuses the fragrance of His knowledge in every place. ¹⁵For we are to God the fragrance of Christ among those who are being saved and among those who are perishing.

¹Therefore be imitators of God as dear children. ²And walk in love, as Christ also has loved us and given Himself for us, an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet-smelling aroma.

¹⁶For even in Thessalonica you sent aid once and again for my necessities. ¹⁷Not that I seek the gift, but I seek the fruit that abounds to your account. ¹⁸Indeed I have all and abound. I am full, having received from Epaphroditus the things sent from you, a sweet-smelling aroma, an acceptable sacrifice, well pleasing to God.

¹⁴how much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without spot to God, cleanse your conscience from dead works to serve the living God?

⁸And the priest who offers anyone's burnt offering, that priest shall have for himself the skin of the burnt offering which he has offered.

Grain – Hebrew word – מְנְחָה – min chah

– from an unused root meaning to bestow or gift or tribute.

¹⁵But the free **gift** is not like the offense. For if by the one man's offense many died, much more the grace of God and the **gift** by the grace of the one Man, Jesus Christ, abounded to many.

²³For the wages of sin is death, but the **gift** of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

⁸For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the **gift** of God, ⁹not of works, lest anyone should boast.
