Burnt Offering – Lev. 1:1-17; 6:8-13 – This offering is the foundation to all the offerings. It was a Voluntary Offering Lev. 1:3 – A Picture of Jesus who delighted in doing the Father's will. John 4:34; Phil.2:8. Jesus offered Himself without spot or blemish to God. Heb.9:14; 10:47. Besides the skin, this offering was totally consumed on the Altar.

⁴⁵For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many."

²⁹The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "**Behold! The Lamb** of God who takes away the sin of the world!

¹⁹Oh, do not deliver the life of Your turtledove to the wild beast!



¹⁸Bring your father and your households and come to me; I will give you the best of the land of Egypt, and you will eat the fat of the land.
