physical body in which we relate to this world through our five senses. Sight, hearing, smell, taste, touch.

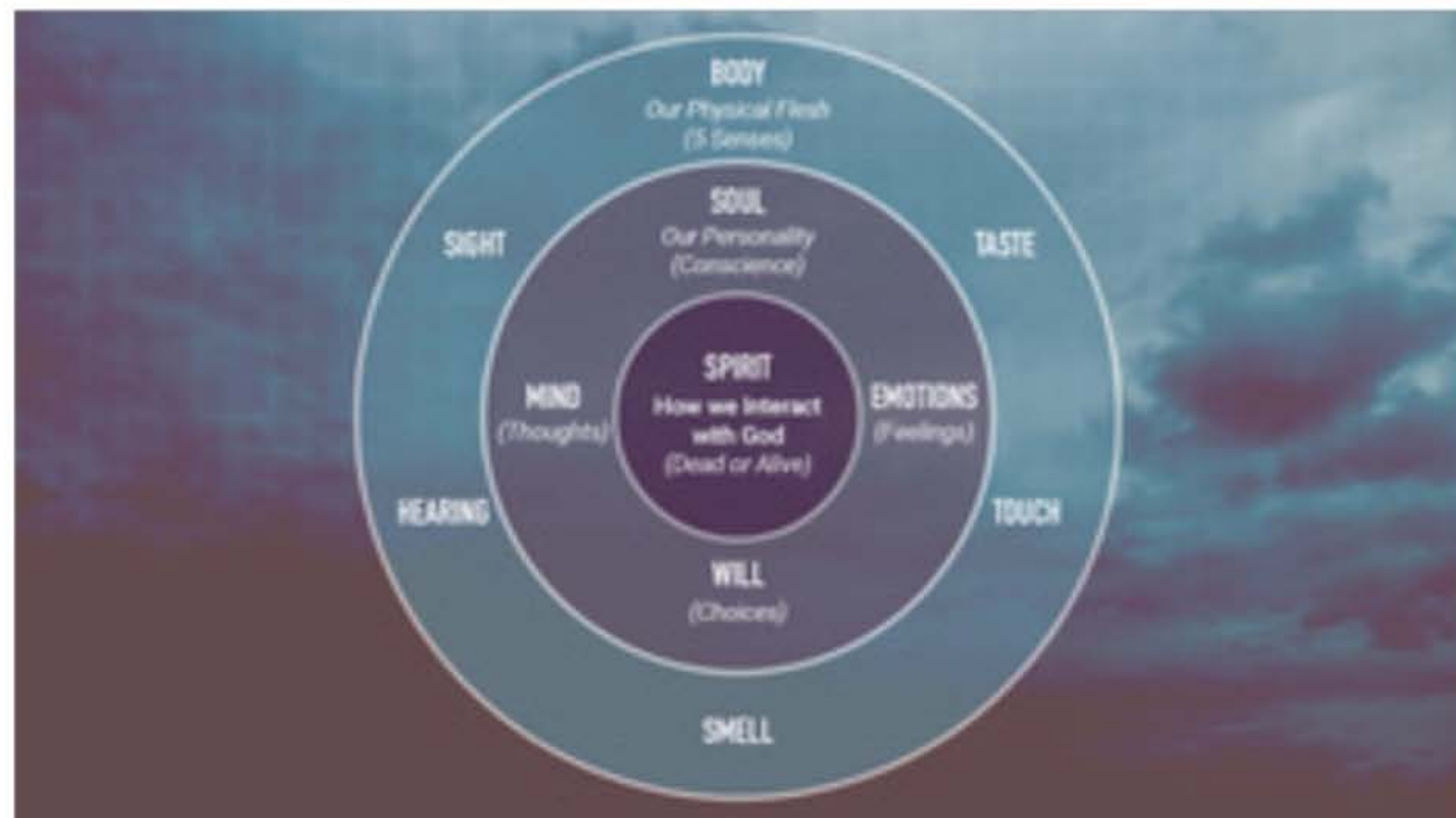

used of past time, or past and future as
well): — eternal, forever, everlasting,
world (began).

Light – Hebrew word - φῶς – phos –
means to shine or make manifest or clear

figuratively): — dark(-ness). From the
word skotos, skot´-os; from the base of
4639; shadiness, i.e. obscurity (literally or
figuratively): — darkness.
