Spirit – Greek word - **πνεῦμα** –
pneuma – means breathe or breath,
which speaks of the Holy Spirit.

Truth – Greek word - **ἀλήθεια** –
aletheia – means what is true in any
matter under consideration. According
to truth, fact, certainty, opposed to that
which is false.
