Am – Greek word - **εἰμί eimi, i-mee´**;
the first person singular present indicative;
a prolonged form of a primary and
defective verb; which means - I exist or I
Am. (used only when emphatic): — am,
have been, x it is I, was.

2 Timothy 4:2 Preach the word! Be ready in season and out of season. Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching.

Titus 3:1 Remind them to be subject to rulers and authorities, to obey, to be ready for every good work,

Faith – Greek word – **πίστις** - **pe** - **stes** -

Conviction of the truth of anything, belief; in the context of God, it is a conviction or belief respecting man's relationship to God and divine things, generally with the included idea of trust and holy fervor born of faith and joined with it relating to God the conviction that God exists and is the creator and ruler of all things, the provider and bestower of eternal salvation through Christ, In relating to Christ a strong and welcome conviction or belief that Jesus is the Messiah, through whom we obtain eternal salvation in the kingdom of God

Substance – Greek word – **ὑπόστασις** -
Hupostasis – confidence, foundation, firmness

Evidence – Greek word – **ἔλεγχος** - **Elegchos**
– proof, conviction, convinced

Now **God** faith is the **Confidence** of things hoped for, the **Conviction** of things not seen.
