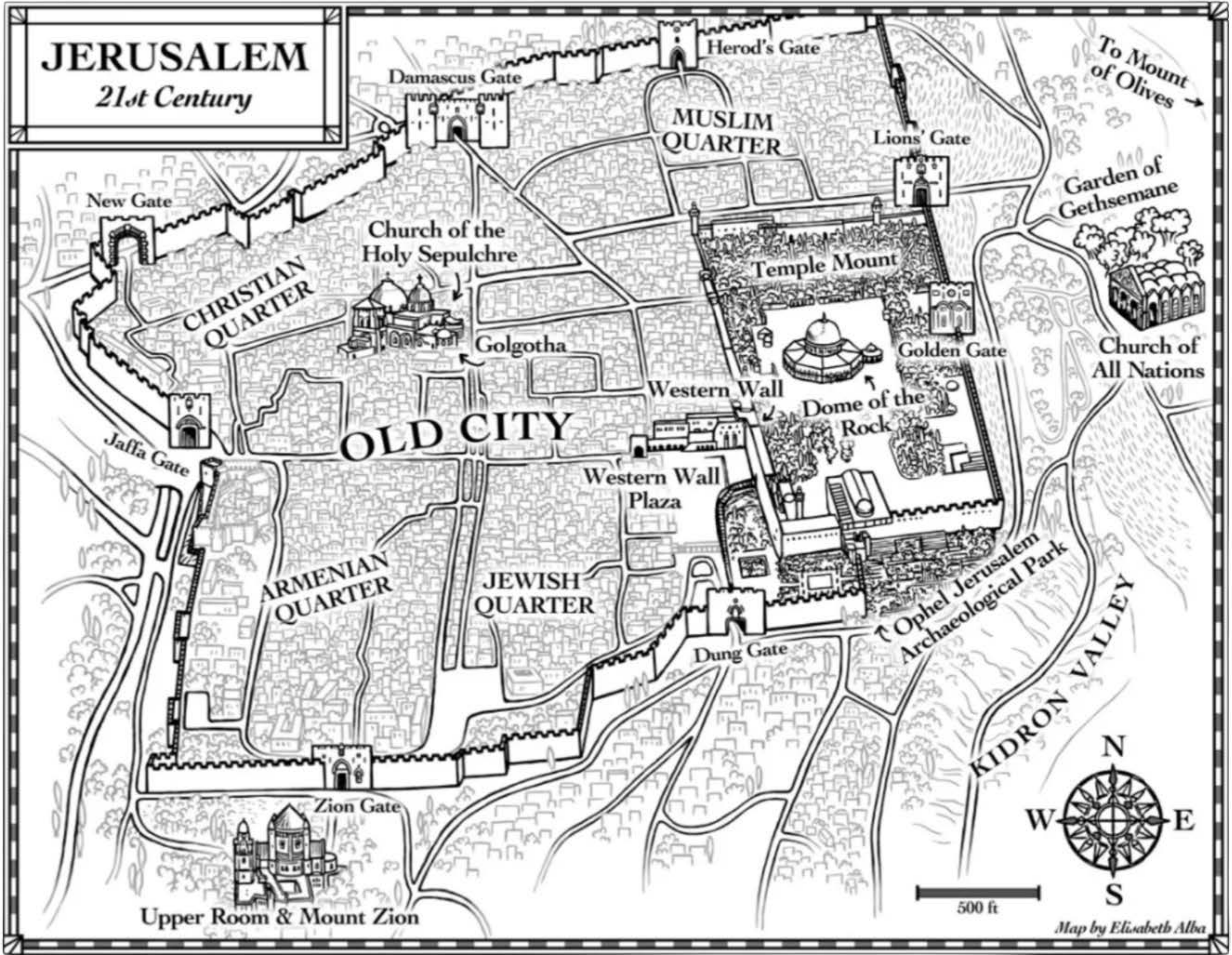

Bethesda – Is a Hebrew word that we only have in the Greek meaning –
Βηθεσδα – means house of mercy, house of grace or house of outpourings.

Sick – Greek word – **ἀσθενέω** – as
then eo – means weak feeble, without
strength or diseased. Same word used
for infirmity in verse 5

Blind – Greek word – **τυφλός** – too
floss means could not physically see.
but the rest of their faculties are
working. They could talk and walk and
do other things.

Lame – Greek word – *χωλός* rai ders
– means cripple or lame or limping.

Paralyzed – Greek word – **ξηρός** **χαι**
ρος – means members of the body
deprived of their natural juices, limbs
shrunk, wasted, withered can't use
arms or legs.

– kai ross – means time or season.

Into – Greek word – *ἐν* – en – means in.

ταράσσω – tarasso, to stir or agitate
(roil water): mix, churn, shake, whip, toss,
heave – trouble.

Whole or Well is the Greek word –
ὕγιής – **hoog-ee-ace** – to restore to
health, a person who is sound in body.
