<sup>21</sup>Now those who had eaten were about five thousand men, besides women and children.

MATTHEW 14:21

<sup>22</sup>Immediately Jesus made His disciples get into the boat and go before Him to the other side, while He sent the multitudes away. <sup>23</sup>And when He had sent the multitudes away, He went up on the mountain by Himself to pray. Now when evening came, He was alone there.

3. 2. Storms of revelation – Mark 4:35-41 – Creator, God
4. 3. Storms of direction – Acts 27 – Paul going to Rome was shipwrecked on Malta.
4. Storms of profession – Daniel 4 – Fiery furnace – Dan. 6 – Lion's Den - to be a witness to others
5. Storms of perfections to develop faith - Matt.14:28-31 – Peter walking on water.

<sup>26</sup>Therefore do not fear them. For there is nothing covered that will not be revealed, and hidden that will not be known.

<sup>27</sup>“Whatever I tell you in the dark, speak in the light; and what you hear in the ear, preach on the housetops. <sup>28</sup>And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. But rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell.

<sup>33</sup>Who shall bring a charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. <sup>34</sup>Who is he who condemns? It is Christ who died, and furthermore is also risen, who is even at the right hand of God, **who also makes intercession for us.**

<sup>8</sup>He alone spreads out the heavens, **And treads on the waves of the sea;** <sup>9</sup>He made the Bear, Orion, and the Pleiades, And the chambers of the south; <sup>10</sup>He does great things past finding out, Yes, wonders without number. <sup>11</sup>**If He goes by me, I do not see Him; If He moves past, I do not perceive Him;**

To **fear God** is the Hebrew word - יְרָאָה  
**yir ah** means – fearing morally, reverent  
or honorable respect, worshipful, this  
fear is out of love.

**Proverbs 1:7** The **fear** of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge, But fools despise wisdom and instruction.

**Proverbs 14:26** In the **fear** of the LORD there is strong confidence, And His children will have a place of refuge.

<sup>51</sup>Then He went up into the boat to them, and the wind ceased. And they were greatly amazed in themselves beyond measure, and marveled. <sup>52</sup>For they had not understood about the loaves, because their heart was hardened.
