## Walk and Please God 1 Thessalonians 4

This letter makes it clear that we cannot simply accept the gift of salvation and continue as we always have. True believers strive to deepen their understanding of God and increase their obedience to Him. Acknowledging that suffering is a regular part of the believer's life, Paul encourages all believers to press on in hope, living lives that please God.

	Sanctification - purification

In the Bible, there are two different kinds of sanctification. Positional sanctification occurs at the time of salvation. The moment we are saved, the blood of Jesus washes us and we can stand righteous in Him before God the Father (1 Corinthians 1:30). Practical (experiential or progressive) sanctification describes the effect of cooperating with the Holy Spirit in obedience to God's Word throughout our lifetime. It is the ongoing

process of sanctification that Paul is talking about here.

While sexual sin is often one of the easiest sins to fall into, it can also be one of the hardest sins to walk away from. It often means making major changes in your life. It may mean quitting a job, ending a relationship, or even changing where you currently live. This can seem overwhelming and might even feel impossible, but nothing is impossible with God. He always provides a way for us to escape and live for Him.

## No One Should Take Advantage of and Defraud His Brother in this Matter

There are two prevailing interpretations of this Scripture. Both are in line with the whole counsel of God's Word, so I will touch on both. First, as believers, we are not to take advantage of another through our sexual immorality.

The King James Version of 1 Thessalonians 4:11 says, "...study to be quiet, and to do your own business, and to work with your own hands..." Most of us could benefit from classes on being quiet, minding our own business, and what it truly means to set aside idleness and focus on something of value.

Read 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18.

Remember, Paul first visited Thessalonica on his second missionary journey and stayed for less than a month. As we study 1 and 2 Thessalonians, we can see that Paul covered a great deal of information (walking worthy, the rapture, the tribulation, and the Antichrist) during his brief visit. In these two letters, Paul seeks to answer their questions regarding these topics. Here, Paul is not defending whether the Rapture will happen, but rather answering the question, "What if someone dies before it does?"

*Ignorant* – not to know through lack of information or intelligence by implication, to ignore

**Those who have fallen asleep** – equivalent to dead

**Caught up** – used of divine power transferring a person marvelously and swiftly from one place to another, to snatch or catch away

## A Closer Look at Brotherly Love

## 1 Thessalonians 4:9

When we come to salvation, we become members of the family of God. Ephesians 2:19 states, "Now, therefore, you are no longer strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God."

The word <b>love</b> in 1 Thessalonians 4:9 is the Greek word <i>philadelphia</i> . In the New Testament, it represents a love that Christians cherish for one another as brothers and sisters in Christ. As children of God, we are called to love all those in God's family.
